



Art and design Topic: Amasis painter

Year: 6 Term: Spring 2

<u>Key Knowledge/Content:</u>

- The children will use technology to research their own artist.
- The children will use sketching pencils to create a detailed sketch.
- The children will use water colours create a detailed painting.
- The children are going to create a collage.

<u>Prior learning:</u>

The children explored Hieroglyphic images and experiment with printing techniques. The children was taught a range of printing techniques.

Key vocabulary with definition: Prior vocabulary:

- Carve To use a tool to cut into a material such as clay.
- Analyse -determining what the features suggest and deciding why the artist used such features to convey specific ideas.
- Formulate to create something, esp. by putting together different parts
- Components components or parts of a work of art that can be isolated and defined.
- Connect To join materials together.

New vocabulary:

- Form -the visible shape or configuration of something.
- Arrange- put (things) in a neat, attractive, or required order.
- Fix To repair or mend.
- Accurate To ensure things are correct such as information, measurements, or predictions.

By the end of this unit

All children can: use water colours to add a foreground and background to painting.

Most children can: demonstrate how to choose sketching pencil and explain what technique they used to add an effect.

Some children can: demonstrate and **explain** using key vocabulary the method, tools and the technique they used to create their collage.

Background understanding for teachers and

<u>parents:</u>

The children are to sketch the vases and use water colours to paint them. The children need to think carefully about the shapes, sizes, colour, the background and foreground. The children are to use sketching pencils. Finally, the children are going to create a collage.
