English

All children can: offer basic information about a story they have read and recall some recurring vocabulary.

Most children can: engage in conversations about stories, recalling story events and characters.

Some children can: talk about the beginning, middle and end of stories, **comment** on characters and setting and **use** some new vocabulary.

Maths

All children can: link numeral to quantity up to 3, using counting to check.

Most children can: link numeral to quantity up to 5 using counting to check.

Some children can: link numeral to quantity up to 5, using subitising or counting to check their answers.

Background understanding for teachers and parents:

During our Minibeasts topic, we will explore the different creatures that live in our Forest area and look at the habitats where they live. We will look at how the changes in seasons start to affect the world around us and observe the changes in our local environment. In class we will read fiction and nonfiction texts linked to our Minibeasts topic.
