



Art and Design Topic: John Banovich

Year: 1 Term: Autumn 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- To know a famous artist is well known and creates pieces of art.
- To understand a sketch is something that is done and is not the final product.
- To know tone means light or dark a colour is.

Key vocabulary with definition:

Prior vocabulary:

- Draw- A technique in which images are depicted on a surface by making lines.
- Colour- The colour of something is the appearance that it has in light.
- Pencil- A tool we use for sketching and drawing.
- Paint brush- A tool we use to create thin and thick lines.

New vocabulary:

- Tone- How light or dark a colour is.
- Similarity- To mean something similar.
- Difference- Not the same.
- Explore- To look closely and discover things.

Prior learning:

The children explored a famous artist called Wayne Barlow who specialised in sketching dinosaurs. The children experimented with different graded pencils to create their own.

Future learning:

The children are going to learning about a famous painter called Katsushika Hokusai.

By the end of this unit

All children can: recognise the difference between the graded pencil and explain how to add detail to a sketch. Most children can: demonstrate how to add tone to a sketch and explain how their own work is similar and different to an artist.

Some children can: explain why we add detail to sketch and be able to compare their work to others.

Background understanding for teachers and parents:

The children are going to be learning about a well-known sketching artist called John Banovich. The children will discuss, explore tone and create their own sketch inspired by Banovich's work.
