



Art and Design Topic: Van Gogh

Year: 1 Term: Spring 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- I know that artists experiment with tone and shade.
- I know that artists must experiment when creating their pieces.
- I know that Van Gogh created still life paintings and sketches (Sunflowers, Gladioli and Chinese Asters).
- I know that Van Gogh painted the sunflowers to experiment with colour and tone.
- I know that artists develop ideas from first hand observation.

<u>Links to:</u>

Prior learning:

The children focused on an artist called Katsushika Hokusai. The children were taught how to select paint brushes, how to create thin and thick lines and discuss their own work.

<u>Future learning:</u>

The children are going to be learning about a sculpting artist called Noriko Karasumi.

Key vocabulary with definition: Prior vocabulary:

- Primary colour Colours that can't be created by a mixture (Blue, Yellow, Red).
- Secondary colour A secondary colour is a colour made by mixing of two primary colours in a given colour space.
- Mix Combine two or more substances to make one.

New vocabulary:

- Tone How light or dark something is.
- Observation the act of careful watching and listening.
- Experiment is a test of an idea or a method.
- Shade where an artist adds black to a colour to darken it down.
- Media the materials used by an artist to make their work.

By the end of this unit

All children can: identify what media has been used in a piece of artwork, **name** primary colours and **talk** about an artist's work.

Most children can: demonstrate how to create different shades, **demonstrate** how to choose a paintbrush and be able to **talk** about their own work.

Some children can: explain what they like about their own work and others and **explain** skills needed to create different shades.

Background understanding for teachers and

<u>parents:</u>

The children are going to be learning about a famous artist called Van Gogh. The children will be learning how to create different shades. The children will use Van Gogh for inspiration to create their own spring painting.
