



RE Topic: What can we learn from stories and prayers of Jesus.

Year: 1 **Term:** Summer 1

Key Knowledge/Content:

Teaching about what we can learn from stories and prayers of Jesus.

This unit enables pupils to develop:

- **Spiritually-** Learn about and reflect on important concepts, experiences and beliefs that are at the heart of Christianity and use techniques of reflection for learning.
- **Morally-** Consider how the teachings of Jesus lead to actions and concerns.
- **Culturally-** Consider how beliefs about Jesus have been expressed through the creative and expressive arts in different global settings
- **Socially-** Consider how our powers can be used for the benefit of others.

Links to:

Prior learning:

Listen to stories about Jesus and understand the importance of him to Christians.

Future learning:

Deepen their learning and look at the Miracles of Jesus.

Key vocabulary with definition:

Prior vocabulary:

- **Christian-** Relating to or professing Christianity or its teachings
- **Christ-** The title, also treated as a name, given to Jesus.
- **Jesus-** The central figure of the Christian religion.
- **Church-** A building used for public Christian worship.

New vocabulary:

- **Disciples-** A personal follower of Christ during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles.
- **Community-** A group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common.

By the end of this unit

All children can: recognise and listen to a prayer and know that it is important to Christian people.

Most children can: demonstrate a meaning for one of the stories listened to in this topic and be able to re-tell it.

Some children can: demonstrate and explain some big questions and give thoughtful answers about the meanings of a prayer.

Background understanding for teachers and parents:

This unit enables pupils to examine some stories of Jesus with a focus on prayers. Christians believe he was the perfect expression of God; 'The Christ'; Son of God; Saviour. The focus is on God as a source of power as revealed through the stories, actions and teachings of Jesus in Christian belief and Scripture. Pupils will learn about the meaning of the Lord's Prayer and its place in Christian prayer today.
