Most children can: recognise and name some of the instruments they hear; **copy and clap back** rhythms; **use** 3 notes when composing music; and **play** instrumental parts in time.

Some children can: understand that songs have a musical style; **recognise** all of the instruments they hear; and **use** 2 notes when improvising music.
