



**Art and Design Topic:** Hannah Hoch

**Year: 3 Term:** Spring 1

## Key Knowledge/Content:

- To know a famous artist is well known and creates pieces of art.
- Collage is a technique of creating artwork by attaching different materials, such as paper and fabric, to a canvas or paper.

## Links to:

### Prior learning:

The children were taught about an artist called Andrew Ellis who was a sketching artist. The children explored the sketching pencils and charcoal to add details.

### Future learning:

The children will be learning about a famous artist called John Clang.

## Key vocabulary with definition:

### Prior vocabulary:

- Charcoal – A type of media used in art.
- Shadow- An area of darkness, caused by light being blocked by something.
- Realism – An artistic movement characterised by subjects painted from everyday life in a naturalistic manner.

### New vocabulary:

- Abstract - A form of art with no recognisable subject, it doesn't represent images of our everyday lives.
- Portrait - Focus on a person's face and often displays how the person looks, and/or their personality.
- Landscape - Well-known type of art that often shows a scene from nature, such as the countryside.
- Clippings - A small piece trimmed from something.

## By the end of this unit

**All children can:** **explain** their ideas and **state** the techniques that they are going to use.

**Most children can:** **demonstrate** how to select, cut and place materials and **evaluate** their work suggesting how it is similar and different to others.

**Some children can:** **explain** the challenges faced during the making process and strategies used to overcome the barriers.

## Background understanding for teachers and parents:

Hannah Hoch is a collage artist. The children will explore Hoch's designs and discuss her artwork. The children will be learn a simple technique of cutting and placing materials. The children will evaluate their work and compare to the original artist.
