## French Topic: Les Glaces (Ice Creams)

## Key Knowledge/Content:

- I can name and spell some ice-cream flavours in French (with accurate pronunciation).
- I can say which flavour ice-cream I would like using the structure 'je voudrais...'
- I can use the conjunction 'et' (and) to ask for more than one flavour.
- Phonics Focus: CH OU ON

## By the end of this unit

All children can: name and spell some ice cream flavours (using the correct article) in French with accurate pronunciation.
Most children can: say in French which of the ten flavours I like and dislike.
Some children can: understand the language required to ask a question in French regarding their opinion of a flavour and understand how to answer the question in French (using the positive and negative form).

## Background understanding for teachers and parents:

This unit will be focused around the children recognising and spelling ten ice cream flavours in the French language. The children will also be learning how to ask a question (Do you like a particular flavour?) and answer it in French including a simple opinion (I like..., I do not like...).
