



French Topic: Petit Chaperon Rouge (Little Red Riding Hood)

Year: 3 Term: Summer 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- To listen attentively to a whole familiar fairy tale in French.
- To increase memory potential in French by using picture cards, word cards and phrase cards in French
- To improve gist reading and gist listening skills.
- To attempt to re-tell a familiar fairy tale in French.
- To increase thinking and reasoning skills in French, identifying strategies to use in the future for memorising new words and phrases.
- Phonics Focus: I IN IQUE ILLE

Prior learning:

- The letter sounds (phonics & phonemes) from phonics and pronunciation
- Basic decoding skills to help deal with longer text that will contain much unfamiliar language.

Future learning:

To manipulate the language with increased language awareness.

This unit will be focused around the children learning to listen attentively to a familiar fairy tale in French and learn strategies to help decode longer pieces of spoken and written text that will contain unknown language.
