



Geography topic: North America, Rio and South East Brazil

Year: 3 Term: Summer 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- Locational knowledge- Locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on North and South America, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries, and major cities.
- Place knowledge- Understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography within North or South America.
- Human and physical geography- Understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of the human and physical geography of a region of the UK and a region within America.

Future learning:

To conduct detailed field work about the Amazon rainforest.

Key vocabulary with definition:

Prior vocabulary:

- Latitude The angular distance of a place north or south of the Earth's equator, or of the equator of a celestial object, usually expressed in degrees and minutes.
- Longitude- The angular distance of a place east or west of the Greenwich meridian, or west of the standard meridian of a celestial object, usually expressed in degrees and minutes.
- Tropical- Very hot and humid.

- Time zone- A geographic region within which the same standard time is used.
