



Music Topic: Glockenspiel Stage 1

Year: 3 Term: Autumn 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- Musical activities- Learn to play and read the notes C, D, E + F.
- Learn to play different tunes using C, D, E + F.
- Improvise with Dee Cee's Blues using the notes C + D.
- Compose using the notes C, D, E + F.
- Perform and share one or more of the following:
- Improvisations
- Instrumental performances
- Compositions

Links to:

Prior learning:

To recognise dot notation and match it to 3 note tunes played on tuned percussion.

Future learning:

To recognise and understand the symbols for a crotchet, minim and rests and say how many beats they represent.

Key vocabulary with definition: Prior vocabulary:

- Pulse- A steady beat
- Rhythm Long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.
- Pitch High and low sounds.
- Dynamics How loud or quiet the music is.
- Tempo The speed of the music; fast or slow or in-between.
- Texture Layers of sound. Layers of sound working together make music very interesting to listen to.
- Structure Every piece of music has a structure e.g. an introduction, verse and chorus ending.
- Improvise- To create music on the spot.
- Compose- To write music

New vocabulary:

 Notation- The symbols used in written music to help players know which note to play and for how long.

By the end of this unit:

All children can: play the notes C, D, E + F on the glockenspiel and compose a simple melody using up to four notes.

Most children can: understand the difference between pulse and rhythm and **improvise** using up to three notes. **Some children can: read** the notes C, D, E + F and **understand** how pulse, rhythm and pitch work together to create a song.

Background understanding for teachers and

parents:

The learning is focused around exploring and developing playing skills through the glockenspiel. As well as learning to play a range of songs, children will improvise and compose using up to four notes.
