## Key Knowledge/Content:

- To know a famous artist is well known and creates pieces of art.
- Collage is a technique of creating artwork by attaching different materials, such as paper and fabric, to a canvas or paper.

## Prior learning:

The children were taught about an artist called Charles Gogin. The children identified complimentary colours and experimented with colour mixing.

## Key vocabulary with definition:

## Prior vocabulary:

- 3D - Art with all the dimensions of height, width, and depth.
- Emotion - Expressing feelings.
- Tone - The lightness or darkness within a picture.
- Blend - The technique of gently intermingling two or more colours or values to create a gradual transition or to soften lines.

New vocabulary:

- Mood- The atmosphere in a painting, or the feeling expressed.
- Fragments- A small part broken off or separated from something.
- Arrange- Put (things) in a neat, attractive, or required order.
- Composition- The way in which something has been put together.


## By the end of this unit

All children can: explain what a collage is and explain the technique used.
Most children can: explain their choice of style and explain how and why they have selected their media.
Some children can: explain if their collage is abstract and express a mood to explain their important message.

## Background understanding for teachers and parents:

The children are going to be learning about a famous artist called Derek Gores. Gores was a famous collage artist. The children will be using a range of materials to create their own using inspiration from Gores' work.
