Art and Design Topic: Nike Davies-Okundaye

Year: 5 Term: Spring 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- To discuss what they like, dislike a current artist's artwork.
- To mix and create paint to make new colours of different tones.
- To create a background and foreground in a painting inspired by Nike Davies-Okundaye.
- To create a detailed pattern to be used in a mosaic.

Links to:

Prior learning:

The children are going to be learning about a famous artist called Rabindranth Tagore. The children will create a sketch and use their sketch to create a sculpture.

Future learning:

The children are going to be learning about a famous artist called Sam Bailey.

Key vocabulary with definition:

Prior vocabulary:

- Sculpt Create or represent (something) by carving, casting, or other shaping techniques.
- Carve To cut with care or exactness.
- Mould To shape or form something.
- Annotate Add notes to (a text or diagram) giving explanation or comment.

New vocabulary:

- Textile A textile is a material consisting of a network of fibres, such as cloth or woven fabrics.
- Hatching- The drawing or engraving of fine, parallel or crossed lines to show shading.
- Cross hatching Drawing. to shade or hatch (forms, figures, etc) with two or more sets of parallel lines that cross one another.
- Impressionism- Impression' of what the person, light, atmosphere, object or landscape looked like to them

By the end of this unit

All children can: use digital technology to research Nike Davies-Okundaye and **create** a detailed painting and mixing colours.

Most children can: shape clay, using carving tools to add detail, and explain their method and technique.

Some children can: confidently explain how they will experiment with a range of media and create a detail to add an effect.
