Key Knowledge/Content:

- To know that you can create layering with oil pastels.
- To know that you can pre-blend colours before applying it onto paper.
- To know you can mix colours when using oil pastels.
- To know that oil pastels came from Japan.

Prior learning:

The children learned about a famous artist called Nike Davies-Okundaye. The children researched the artist, created and compared mosaics.

Future learning:

The children are going to be learning about an artist called Carol Naylor.

Key vocabulary with definition:

Prior vocabulary:

- Textile A textile is a material consisting of a network of fibres, such as cloth or woven fabrics.
- Hatching- The drawing or engraving of fine, parallel or crossed lines to show shading.
- Cross hatching —To shade or hatch (forms, figures, etc) with two or more sets of parallel lines that cross one another.
- Impressionism- Impression of what the person, light, atmosphere, object or landscape looked like to them.

New vocabulary:

- Shadowing- A dark area or shape produced by a body coming between rays of light and a surface.
- Reflections- The throwing back by a body or surface of light, heat or sound without absorbing it.
- Criteria A principle or standard by which something may be judged or decided.
- Innovative- A feature, new method, idea and creative thinking of a product.

By the end of this unit

All children can: demonstrate how to add shadow add reflections on to a sketch to make their art piece more appealing and **communicate** with others to generate ideas.

Most children can: demonstrate and explain a criteria of what I want my sketch and painting to include and **explain** how I made my final piece of art work look appealing.

Some children can: explain the characteristics of oil pastels and how they can be used to add effect.

Background understanding for teachers and parents:

The children are going to be learning about a local famous artist called Sam Bailey. The children are going to be researching, sketching and using oil pastels to add colour. The children will be inspired by Bailey's work.
