



French Topic: Les Romains (The Romans)

Year: 5 Term: Spring 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- Understand the key facts of the history of Ancient Rome in French.
- Say and spell the days of the week in French.
- Name some/all of the most famous Roman inventions in French.
- Write a diary of life as a rich and/or poor child in Roman times including the use of the negative form in French.
- Change sentences from the positive to their negative form
- Phonics Focus: É E È EAU EUX

Use the negative in French from units like 'En Classe', and 'As-Tu Un Animal? and/or 'Chez Moi'.

Future learning:

Listen and understand the key facts of the ancient and modern Olympics recounted in French and improve their decoding of longer unfamiliar texts in French using key language learning strategies.

Background understanding for teachers and parents:

This unit will focus on the children improving their decoding skills of longer text with less familiar language in the context of 'The Romans'. They will learn the 7 days of the week and see how these are connected to the Roman Gods. Finally, they will complete a written diary entry as a rich and poor Roman child describing their life in French.
