



Geography topic: Maps

Year: 5 Term: Summer 2

### Key Knowledge/Content:

- Locational knowledge- To be able to locate countries on a range of maps such as digitally, in an atlas and on a globe.
- Geographical skills and fieldwork To use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied.

### Key vocabulary with definition: Prior vocabulary:

- Symbol- A mark or character used as a conventional representation of an object.
- Linear- Arranged in or extending along a straight or nearly straight line.
- Grid reference- A map reference indicating a location in terms of a series of vertical and horizontal grid lines identified by numbers or letters.

#### New vocabulary:

 Scales- The scale of a map is the ratio of a distance on the map to the corresponding distance on the ground.

Prior learning: To begin to use 4 point grid reference on a map.

**Future learning:** 

To use linear scales accurately.

### By the end of this unit

All children can: recognise symbols on a range of maps.

Most children can: demonstrate using a 6-figure grid reference to locate places and objects on a map. Some children can: demonstrate and compare using different features to create a map including physical and human features.
