## By the end of this unit

Some children can: understand the legacy left by Henry VIII, especially for people of religion, and explain which sources can be seen as reliable and why.

# Background understanding for teachers and parents:

This unit will introduce children to Tudor England through the focus on King Henry VIII. Children will explore what time of King Henry VIII using sources such as his early reign, his marriages and the changes to religion and rebellions during his reign.
