



PSHE Topic: How can drugs common to everyday life affect health?

Year: 5 Term: Summer 1

Key Knowledge/Content:

- **Physical health and wellbeing-** Learn how to make informed decisions about their health.
- Healthy lifestyles and physical wellbeing- Recognise that habits can have both positive and negative effects on a healthy lifestyle.
- **Keeping safe-** Learn about organisations that can support people concerning drug support.

Prior learning:

Key vocabulary with definition: Prior vocabulary:

- **Immunity-** The ability of an organism to resist a particular infection or toxin by the action of specific antibodies or sensitized white blood cells.
- **Diseases** A disorder of structure or function in a human, animal, or plant, especially one that has a known cause and a distinctive group of symptoms, signs, or anatomical changes.
- **Peer influence** Peer influence is when the behaviour of one or more people who are similar in age affects or changes the behaviour of another person or group.

New vocabulary:

- Addiction The fact or condition of being addicted to a particular substance or activity.
- **Recreational-** Relating to or denoting drugs taken on an occasional basis.

By the end of this unit

All children can: recognise some choices they make can support a healthy lifestyle and recognise what might influence these.

Most children can: demonstrate the difference between positive and negative habits and **understand** how these affect a healthy lifestyle.

Some children can: demonstrate and **explain** how the impact of everyday legal drugs have on our health.
