By the end of this unit

All children can: Identify verbs in sentences and begin to tell the time using common and repeated phrases such as quarter to, half past and quarter past.

Most children can: Understand a range of phrases in French and **speak** in sentences about some activities that they do at the weekend.

Some children can: Give an account from memory what someone has done at the weekend and at what time, integrating conjunctions into their work.

Background understanding for teachers and parents:

This unit will focus on the children learning how to say and write what activities they do at the weekend, at what time they do them but also whether they like them or not. This unit will also encourage them to link ideas together, using conjunctions to create longer and more interesting replies.
