#### Key Knowledge/Content:

- To describe height, eye colour and character
- To the high frequency irregular verb avoir (to have), j'ai (I have)
- To use some French daily routine phrases
- To look out primarily for cognates (words that are similar in French and English)
- Phonics Focus: QU Ç GNE EN AN

## Prior learning:

- •The letter sounds (phonics & phonemes) from phonics and pronunciation
- •To use basic grammar including (where relevant): feminine, masculine and neuter forms and the conjugation of high-frequency verbs

#### Future learning:

To use key features and patterns of the language in a different context (Me in the world) and revisit grammar from Early Learning and Intermediate units.

## Key vocabulary with definition:

#### Prior vocabulary:

 To use French daily routine phrases with high frequency regular & irregular verbs and conjunctions.

#### New vocabulary:

- To use possessives & reflexive verbs.
- To use the first-person conjugation of the high frequency irregular verb 'être' (to be) 'je suis' (I am), with an opportunity in the challenge section to move to third person singular 'il/elle est' (he/she is).
- To also look at the rules of adjectival agreement in more detail and depth that are required in French when describing a male and/or female.

## By the end of this unit

All children can: use the high frequency irregular verb avoir (to have), j'ai (I have)

Most children can: use some French daily routine phrases

Some children can: understand rules of adjectival agreement in more detail and depth that are required in

French when describing a male and/or female.

# Background understanding for teachers and parents:

In this unit, children will complete a range of activities, starting with describing themselves in French. They will be using a typical Viking family that they will meet in this lesson as a model. They will then describe their own daily routine in French as a Viking man or woman
