



PE Topic: Invasion Games (Hockey)

Year: 6 Term: Autumn 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- To enjoy communicating, collaborating and competing with each other.
- To develop an understanding of how to improve in different physical activities and sports and learn how to evaluate and recognise their own success.
- To play competitive games and apply basic principles suitable for attacking and defending.
- To develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance.
- To compare their performances with previous ones and demonstrate improvement to achieve their personal best.

Links to:

Prior learning:

To understand when the best time is to pass, score, etc.

Future learning:

To keep possession, move into a scoring position, and prevent the opposition from scoring.

Key vocabulary with definition:

Prior vocabulary:

- Keep possession – Keeping the ball within your team.
- Passing – Moving the ball from one person to another.
- Shooting – Attempting to score.
- Attackers – Those working together to score.
- Defenders – Those working together to stop the opposition from scoring.
- Stance – Position of body.
- Team play – Working effectively with others.

New vocabulary:

- Dribbling – To move the ball along by a rapid succession of short pushes.
- Flick – Shooting the ball by elevating it with the stick.
- Marking – Tracking an individual player.
- Hitting – When the hockey stick makes contact with the ball.
- Pitch – The playing surface of a game of hockey.

By the end of this unit

All children can: shoot at a goal with confidence and good technique.

Most children can: dribble with a hockey stick with accuracy, confidence and control.

Some children can: choose tactics for defence and attack.

Background understanding for teachers and parents:

This half term is Invasion Games, with a focus on Hockey. The children will learn how to pass the ball, as well as skills such as interception and shooting. They will be able to practise these skills within small team games.
