



PE: Striking and Fielding

Year: 6 **Term:** Spring 2

Key Knowledge/Content:

- To apply and develop a broader range of skills and learn how to use them in different ways.
- To communicate, collaborate and compete with each other.
- To understand how to improve in different physical activities and sports and learn how to evaluate and recognise their own success.
- To use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination.
- To play competitive games and apply basic principles suitable for attacking and defending.

Prior learning:

To be able to direct the ball comfortably towards a target area.

Future learning:

To be able to organise themselves in a game and be able to explain the rules to others.

Key vocabulary with definition:

Prior vocabulary:

- Points – when a team scores, they earn points.
- Rules – to ensure games are played fairly and safely.
- Target – where you aim for in order to achieve something.
- Hitting – using the rounders bat to send the ball away.
- Stance – the position your body is in.

New vocabulary:

- Passing – the movement of the ball from one person to another.
- Team play – working together to play a game.
- Bowler – a player who throws the ball to the person batting.
- Batting – the team who are trying to score.
- Base – the intermittent posts around the field.
- Fielding – the team who are trying to catch the others out.
- Rounder – how the score is recorded.
- Backstop – a player who stands behind the person batting.

By the end of this unit

All children can: play games that improve their batting, bowling and fielding skills.

Most children can: hold a rounders bat and strike a ball effectively.

Some children can: understand why we have tactics in sport.

Background understanding for teachers and parents:

This half term is Striking and Fielding, which focuses on Rounders. The children will improve their batting, bowling and fielding skills. They will learn the rules of rounders and take part in team games.
